Fire crews respond to dangerous goods incident and structure fire Sunday night

At approximately 7:30 p.m. on Sunday, October 8, crews from the Clairmont and Dunes stations and the Village of Hythe Fire Department responded to a dangerous goods incident on the British Columbia/Alberta border.

Crews arrived on scene to find a rolled over and damaged truck that was leaking a corrosive material. Crews were able to stop the leak, contain the spilled material, and remain on scene to ensure there is no danger to the public.

On Sunday, October 8 at approximately 11:30 p.m., firefighters from the Clairmont and Dunes stations as well as the Town of Sexsmith Fire Department responded to a structure fire in Clairmont.

When crews arrived on scene, the shed to the rear of the structure was fully involved and had extended to the resident's home. Fire crews were able to enter the home and bring the fire under control containing it to the rear end of the home. The occupants were home at the time of the fire, and were able to get out safely and unharmed. The fire is currently under investigation.
