

Skunks 101!

Skunk Facts That Don't Stink

- Skunks are nocturnal, primarily active at night
- Their diet mostly consists of insects and rodents (mice).
- Will eat farm eggs and dog food if available
- Will raid bee hives
- While they do not fully hibernate, they become inactive during the winter months
- 4 to 7 skunks born per litter
- Usually the young will venture 5-10km but can in some cases travel 50km
- Can live up to 7 years in the wild, but most only live a year
- Not protected in Alberta
- Have a great nose but bad eyesight!



How to prevent skunks from living on your property

- Block off areas where skunks may like to make a home, such as under decks, sheds, or houses.
- Clear brush piles and old vehicles, as skunks like to live there
- Remove easily available food sources
- Put mothballs under buildings (Skunks don't like the smell...)

Tips when dealing with skunks

- If a skunk finds its way into a home or other building, open a door and allow the skunk to leave on their own time. Do not agitate the skunk, or you risk them spraying.
- It is illegal for anyone to use poisons to kill nuisance skunks
- Skunks den during winter months so that is the best time to safely remove them and any shelter they have made on your property.
