Motorists advised to use caution as crews work to clear snow from County roads

County snow removal crews are working to clear drifting snow from local gravel and rural roads.

Crews dedicated to snow removal in residential areas will begin clearing in Clairmont from 100 – 113 Avenue starting tomorrow morning. Temporary parking restrictions will be in effect from 7 a.m. until 7 p.m.

Once clearing is completed in that area, crews will move onto the subdivisions of Whispering Ridge and Westlake Village in Clairmont, then Wedgewood, Maple Ridge and Taylor Estates.

When clearing ice and snow from designated residential areas, temporary parking restrictions are put in place 24 hours in advance, when possible, and “No Parking” signage will be posted at entrances to the area. When “No Parking” signs are visible, parking on roadways and streets is not permitted between 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m.

Vehicles left on the street when a parking restriction is in place may be ticketed and/or towed. Residents are reminded to not pile or push snow from their driveways or property onto the roads as it slows the snow clearing process and creates a traffic safety hazard.

Due to heavy snowfall and drifting snow, road conditions are not favourable. Motorists are asked to consider postponing non-essential travel. If you must travel please ensure you are carrying a fully charged cellphone in case a call to 9-1-1 is required, as well as an emergency roadside kit.

As a reminder, all primary and secondary highways are the responsibility of and maintained by Alberta Transportation.
