Policy Purpose

To manage and control brush on County of Grande Prairie roadside Right-of-Ways.

Policy Statement

The County maintains municipal roadside Right-of-Ways to protect the integrity of the road and ensure adequate sight lines for safe road travel.

Definitions

“Brush” means woody perennial vegetation.

“County” means the municipality of the County of Grande Prairie No. 1 having jurisdiction under the Municipal Government Act and other applicable legislation.

“Right-of-Ways” means a general term referring to land between property lines the part of the public road which includes shoulders and ditches

Policy Guidelines

1. The Agricultural Service Board will work cooperatively with the Public Works Department on the Brush Control Along County Roadside Right-of-Ways program.
2. The Public Works Public Department shall remove brush within the County roadside Right-of-Ways. The Public Works Department shall inform the Agriculture Department of areas of brush control by April 15th of each year.
3. In the growing season following the brush removal, the Agricultural Service Board shall apply a registered herbicide to control brush regrowth.
4. Ratepayers may enter into a “No Spray Agreement” with the County Agricultural Service Board whereby no herbicides will be applied to roadsides adjacent to lands under their control.



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5. All County roadside Right-of-Ways will be subject to herbicide application on a spot treatment basis where brush is present. Each year an advertisement shall be posted in the County newsletter, on the County website and in area newspapers prior to herbicide application to inform the public.

County of Grande Prairie No. 1**Roadside Noxious / Prohibited Noxious Weed and Brush Control Program****NO SPRAY AGREEMENT**

Due April 15, annually. Late applications will be subject to a \$25 administration fee.

I/We, the undersigned, hereby request that the County of Grande Prairie No. 1 refrain from the application of herbicides by the lands noted, which I/We own.

I/We hereby:

- Acknowledge and accept my/our duty to maintain that portion of the municipal roadway that lies between the boundary of my/our property and the centerline of the roadway, ensuring that it remains free of all Prohibited Noxious and Noxious weeds, and brush and/or tall vegetation (e.g., Sweet Clover) which may interfere with motorist sightlines. I/we acknowledge my/our duty to ensure that at all times:
 - a. Noxious weeds are prevented from flowering
 - b. Prohibited noxious weeds are completely destroyed (all parts of the plant)
 - c. brush and tall vegetation will be controlled
- Understand that if the weed and brush control is not implemented to the satisfaction of the Agricultural Fieldman for the County of Grande Prairie No. 1, registered participants in this program will be given five days to control the weeds and brush. If not controlled to the satisfaction of the Agricultural Fieldman, the Agricultural department will control the weeds and brush as the Agricultural Fieldman sees fit, and future exemptions may not be considered in subsequent years. Control methods may include the use of herbicides. No Spray areas will be inspected each year to ensure compliance with this agreement.
- Agree that this Agreement becomes null and void if any noxious or prohibited noxious weeds described by the Weed Control Act of Alberta, or any brush are found a second time in any areas covered under this agreement.
- Understand and agree that only the registered landowner may apply for No Spray Agreement on their property. If I/we lease/rent land, we hereby agree that it is our yearly responsibility to obtain the landowners permission and signature to participate in this program.
- Understand and agree that municipality right of ways shall in no way substitute for buffer zones for sensitive areas or vegetation designated for Organic Production.
- Understand and acknowledge that the No Spray Agreement is valid in the year it is signed, expiring December 31st of each year. All registrants must renew No Spray Agreements annually, and agreements must be received in the County office no later than April 15th of each year to be considered a participant in the County No Spray Program. I/We understand that failure to renew the No Spray Agreement and declare intent to continue participation in the program prior to the April 15th deadline will result my/our area being removed from the No Spray Program.

- Agree not to disturb the soil found in any part of the road right of way.
- Agree to indemnify and hold harmless the County of Grande Prairie No. 1 and all the Crown in Right of the Province of Alberta, their agents and employees, from any claims, demands, actions, and costs that may arise as a result of an act or omission in regard to this exemption.
- Understand that the County will supply no spray signs for each exempted area. Signs will be posted each spring by the Agriculture Department according to the diagram on the next page and will be recovered in the fall of each year. No spray signs remain the property of the County of Grande Prairie No.1 and must be returned in the event I/we are no longer a participant in the program.
- Understand and acknowledge that home-made No Spray signs will not be considered valid.
- Understand that no alterations to this form will be accepted.

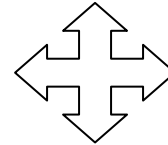
